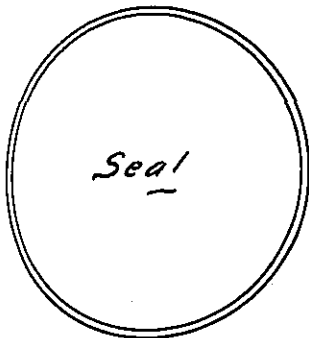


Pensylvania 55



By the Commissioners of Property

Whereas in pursuance of a certain Grant from the Proprietary there was by virtue of a Warrt from ourselves bearing date the 26 day of 4^o 9th Month 1701 laid out to Martin Zeal in the Mann^r of Pensbury fifty Acres of Land under the yearly Quittrent of three pence sterling P^r Acre which said Land because of its barrenness proving too small for a settle^{mt} and improvem^t for the said Martin Application hath been made to us that we would grant him fifty Acres more to be added thereunto and that he might hold the whole at three pence P^r Acre Pensilv^{ia} Money. These are in condescension to the s^d Request to Authorize and Require thee to add to the s^d former Tract fifty Acres more out of the said Mann^r with as little injury to the same as may be, and make Returns of the whole hundred Acres into the gen^l Surveyors Office at Philad^{ia} where this Warrt is to remain and a Copy thereof to be delvd to thee certified by the Secretary.
