

Pursuant to a warrant under the hands of the Commiss^{rs}
of Property and the Seal of the Province bearing date the 26th day of
November 1701 ordering fifty acres of land to be survey'd unto Martin
Zeal Cordwainer in the Proprietaries Mannor of Pensbury on the other
side of the Run near the Shoemaker's on the Creek and Running back to
William Byles's line

There is Survey'd and Laid out unto Martin Zeal a piece of land in the
Proprietaries Mannor of Pensbury beginning—a black oak sapling in
William Biles Line by a meadow Thence by the said Biles's land north east
ninety four perches to a Corner marked black oak from thence by the Prop-
rietaries land south 35 degrees east one hundred twenty four perches to
a gum tree by a small Run then up the same south seventy one degrees west
thirty four perches to a second gum tree Thence North seventy eight
degrees westerly seventy five perches to a third gum tree from thence
through the said meadow north west forty five perches to the place of
beginning Containing ~~(to be)~~ fifty acres Survey'd by Jn^o Cutler the first
of ye ⁶mo 1702 Revised in the General Surveyors office
