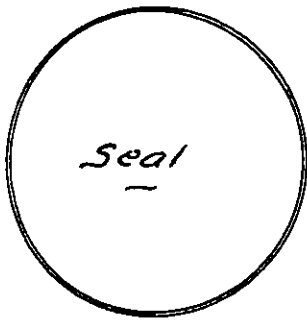

By the Commissioners of Property

At the Request of William Crosdale That we would Grant him to take up two Hundred and fifty Acres of Land being the remainder untaken up of his ffather Thomas Crosdale his Original purchase of one thousand Acres; These are to require thee forthwith to Survey and lay out to the said William Crosdale according to the Method of Townships appointed the said Number of two hundred and fifty Acres of Land in this Province where not already survey'd nor taken up nor concealed nor seated by the Indians, and make Returns into the General Surveyors office at Philadelphia where this Warrant is to remain and a Copy thereof to be deliv'd to thee certified by the Secretary. Given under our hands and the seal of the Province at Philad^{ia} 11th 6^{mo} 1702
