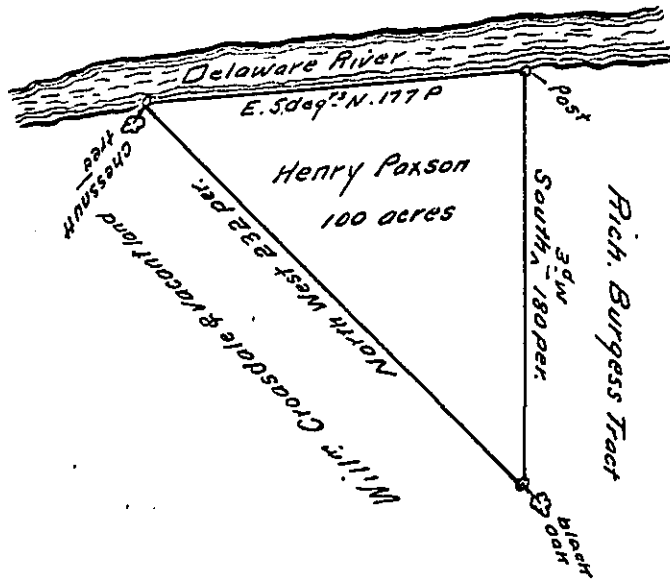

By virtue of a Warrt from the Proprietary's Commissioners to me directed dated the 3rd ^{17th} 1703 Surveyed and layd out unto Henry Paxson (in Right of Edward Jefferson and Mary his wife their original purchase of 1500 acres) A Tract of Land in Soulbury Township in Bucks County Beginning at A Post by the River Delaware at the Corner of Rich. Burgess's Tract, Thence by the said Burgess land South ^{3/4} one hundred and eighty perches to a black oak, Then by William Croasdale & vacant Land North West two hundred and thirty two perches to a Chessnut in the bank of the said River, Then down the same East five degrees North one hundred seventy seven perches to the place of beginning Containing ^{one hundred} ~~ninety four~~ acres layd out the 29th ^{4th} 1703.
