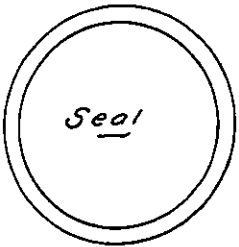

At the Request of Henry Paxon of the County of Bucks That we would Grant him to take up One hundred Acres of Land bought by him of John Day in part of Edward Jefferson and Mercy his wife their Original Purchase of fifteen hundred Acres w<sup>th</sup> s<sup>d</sup> quantity the said Henry alleges is not yet taken up. These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey and Lay out to the said Henry Paxon ~~the said~~ According to the Method of Townships appointed the said quantity of One hundred Acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor taken up nor is concealed nor Seated by the Indians to hold to the s<sup>d</sup> Henry his Heirs and Assigns provided that the afores<sup>d</sup> Purchase of fifteen hundred Acres made by y<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> Jefferson be not already taken up by him his Heirs or Assigns, but that the said quantity of one hundred Acres be yet remaining. Otherwise the said Survey to be void. And make Returns into the General Surveyor's Office at Philad<sup>ia</sup> where this Warr<sup>t</sup> is to remain and a Copy thereof to be delvd to thee certified by the Secretary.
