

By virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietary and Governour bearing date the 26th day of the Sixth month 1700 for laying out unto Daniel Jackson five hundred acres of land in Right of Joseph Barnes old purchaser of the said quantity.

There is survey'd and laid out to the said Daniel Jackson the said quantity of 500 acres of land in the Township of Buckingham in the County of Bucks. Beginning at a post in the line of the land of Mary and Alice Hind. Thence by Richard Hough's land south west two hundred and eighty four perches to a forked black oak. Then North west two hundred eighty two perches to a white oak. Thence by the Widow Musgraves land North east two hundred eighty four perches to a post and a heap of stones. Then South east by the said Hinds land two hundred eighty two perches to the place of the Beginning. Survey'd the 25th of the 3^d month 1702 p. Uno Cutler
