



By vertue of the Commision<sup>rs</sup>. Warrant dated the Eighth day of the 7<sup>th</sup>. mo. th. 1704 surveyed unto Tho. ffairman a certaine peice of Land within the County of Bucks begining at a post in William Bingleys line standing in the street or towneship Roade of War-  
mister neare a marked ash tree which is the Corner of Jo. Morris's Land. Thence south East by the said street 222 perches to a post Thence south west by va.
