Whereas it appears that Jane, <sup>formerly Lyon now</sup> the wife of Richard Lundy of the County of Bucks came into this Province a Servant to Phineas Pemberton and served her time [as is testified by Joseph Mather who was also a Servant in the same family] at the first settling of this Province wherefore the said Richard requests that the fifty Acres of Land usually granted to such Servants might be laid out to him in right of his wife: These therefore are to Authorize and require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said Richard Lundy in right of his said wife's Service According to the Method of Townships the said fifty acres of Land that has <sup>not</sup> been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretary's Office which said fifty acres are to be holden under the yearly quitrent of an English or Sterling half penny for every Acre thereof Given under our hands & ye Seal of ye Province at Philad<sup>a</sup>. ye 10<sup>th</sup> day of 9<sup>br</sup> A. D. 1718.
