



By virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries Commrs. to me directed bearing date the 5th ^{11th}/_{mo.} 1702 to Resurvey all the Tracts or parcels of Land within the County of Bucks which may be reasonably suspected to have been unduly Surveyed [when first taken up] and have not yet been rectified, Resurveyed unto the heirs of Ralph Miller a certain parcel of Land in Makefield township in Bucks County Beginning at a Post being a corner of Joseph Miller's land. Thence by the said Joseph Miller's line ^{and vacant} West five hundred and one perches to a Post by a dead white oak, Then North by vacant thirty five perches to a white oak. Then by vacant, John Baldwin and Samuel Baker's land. East five hundred and one perches to a small Hickory, Then by the said Joseph Miller's land. South thirty five perches to the place of beginning. Containing one hundred and nine acres and Ninety five perches Resurveyed the 16th ^{18th}/_{mo.} 1703. By me John Sution, Deputy Surveyr;
