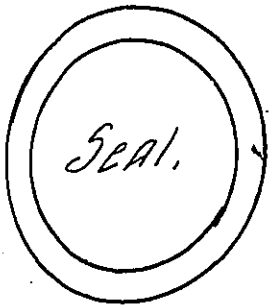


Pennsylvania S.S.



By the Proprietaries.

Whereas by agreement some time since made, there was surveyed and laid out unto Jeremiah Langhorne of the County of Bucks Esqr. the Quantity of Five hundred Acres of Land situate upon Menakasic Creek near the West Branch of the River Delaware in the said County for which He hath paid to our use the full sum of Seventy Seven Pounds ten Shillings current Money of this Province, And is to hold the same of Us our Heirs and Successors under the yearly Quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for every hundred Acres. and the said Jeremiah Langhorne having requested that we would be pleased to issue our Warrant to establish the said Survey. These are therefore to authorize and require thee to make Return of the said Five hundred Acres of Land into our Secretary's Office in order for further Confirmation, and for which this shall be thy sufficient Warrant Given under my Hand, and the lesser Seal of our Province at Philadelphia this 24th Day of February Anno Dom. 1736.
