mentioned County where not already taken up according to  
ye Method of Townships appointed by me, he seating & im-  
proving ye same w<sup>th</sup> One Year after ye Date of Survey, and  
make Returns thereof into my Secretary's Office. Given at  
Philadelphia. ye 29<sup>th</sup>. of ye 5<sup>th</sup>. month, 1684.
