By the Commissioners of Property.

At the Request of Jeremiah Langhorn of the County of Bucks that we would Grant him to take up One Thousand Acres of Land in Right and as part of Three Thousand Acres purchased of the Proprietor by George Beal near Guilford in Great Britain by Deeds of Lease and Release dated the 7th & 8th days of the Eleventh Month in the year 1701. the Right to ^{the} $\frac{1}{2}$ whole [as is Alleg'd] being now Vested in the Said Jeremiah— These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd within the Said Province in Right of the Said purchase According to the Method of Townships appointed the Said quantity of One Thousand Acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof [not exceeding two parcells in the Said one Thousand Acres] into the Secretary's Office in order for a further Confirmation. Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 29th day of ye 5th Month Anno Dni 1717.
