At the Request of Jeremiah Langhorn That we would Grant him to take up five Hundred Acres of Land being the Original Purchase of his ffather Thomas Langhorn in lieu of the Said quantity formerly laid out to him on Brandywine-but disclaimed by the Said Jeremiah— These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be survey'd to him the Said Jeremiah Langhorn according to the Method of Townships appointed the said quantity of five hundred Acres of Land in this Province that has not been already Survey'd nor taken up. nor is conceald nor seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretaries Office. Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philad<sup>ia</sup>. the 28<sup>th</sup> day of the third Month in the Sixth Year of the Reign of Queen Anne of Great Britain &c A. D. 1707.
