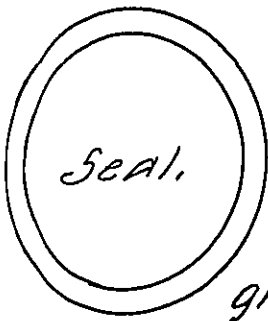

At the Request of Jeremiah Langhorn That we would grant him to take up Two hundred and fifty Acres of Land in this Province by him Purchased of Benjamin White Youngest son of George White in part of the said George's — Original Purchase of two thousand five hundred Acres. These are to Authorize and Require thee forthwith to Survey and lay out, or to return if already Survey'd in pursuance of our former Ord^r about the same to the said Jeremiah Langhorn according to the Method of Townships appointed the said quantity of two hundred and fifty Acres of Land in the County of Bucks that has not been already Survey'd nor taken up nor is concealed nor Seated by the Indians And make Returne into the General Surveyors Office at Philad^a where this Warrnt is to remain and a Copy thereof to be del^{iv}ed to thee certified by the Secretary. Given under our hands And Seal of the Province at Philad^a ye 1st of ye 9th Month 1703.
