



By virtue of a Warrant from the Commissioners of Property bearing date the 11th day of the 4th month Anno. Dni, 1712. Surveyed unto Jeremiah Langhorn & John Chapman [Assignees of John Decow] in right of Isaac Decow's purchase of 2500 acres, a certaine tract of Land in Bucks County upon Scook's Creek near Delaware River beginning at a small black oak in a line of the London Company's Land, ffrom thence extending west by the sd. Line 320 perches to a heap of Stones. Then north by vacant Land 150 perches to another heap of Stones, Then east by vacant Land 320 perches to a white Oak, Then by the sd. Company's Land South 150 perches to the place of beginning, Containing three hundred acres Surveyed the 15th day of the 6th month 1715. Certified under my hand
