



In pursuance of a warrant from the Commiss^{ns}. of Property bearing date the 11th. day of the 9th. month 1712 To survey unto John Decon, one thousand acres in the County of Bucks in part of 2500 acres purchased of the Proprietary by Isaac Decon of Drax Abbey in the County of York in great Britaine [which sd. 1000 acres was given unto the sd. John Decon by will from the sd Isaac] Surveyed and laid out unto Jeremiah Langhorn and John Chapman [Assignees of the sd. John Decon] a tract of Land in Hillton township in Bucks County Beginning at a black oak at a corner of other land of the sd. Jeremiah Langhorn's from thence extending, ^{by the sd. Land} South East two hundred and twelve perches to a Chestnutt tree, Then by vacant land South west one hundred & sixty perches to a small Hickory tree. Then North west by vacant land two hundred and twelve perches to a black oak. Then by Andrew van Bushink's land North East one hundred & sixty perches to the place of beginning Containing two hundred and twelve acres Surveyed the tenth day of the first month 1718 being the Residue of the sd. 1000 acres.
