



By virtue of a warrant from Jacob Taylor Surveyr. Genl. of the Province of Pennsylvania & Territories to me directed bearing date the 29th /³/_{mo} 1707 Surveyed and laid out unto Jeremiah Langhorn a tract of Land in Hilton township in the county of Bucks [in Right of his father Thomas Langhorn's Purchase] Beginning at a black oak at Thomas Hudson's Corner, Thence North West by vacant Land 320 perches to a Hickory tree, Then N.E. by vacant Land 250 perches to a Hickory tree, Then S.E. by Thomas Cam's Land 320 perches to a Post in Cott. Mildmay's line, Then by the 3d. Line S.W. 250 perches to the place of beginning Containeing five hundred Acres. Given under my hand the 3^d /⁴/_{mo} 1707.
