


Pennsylvania s.s.

At the Request of John Moor of Shakamaxen that we would Grant him to take up two hundred Acres of Land in the place called the Great Swamp in Bucks County for which he agrees to pay to the Prop<sup>rs.</sup> use six & twenty pounds thirteen Shillings & four pence for the whole and the usual yearly quitrent of one Shiling Sterling for Each hundred Acres. These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Surveyed unto the Said John Moor in the place aforesaid. According to ye Method of Townships appointed the Said quantity of two hundred Acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians & make a Return thereof into the Secretarys office which Survey in case the Said John Moor fulfills the Above agreement upon Location shall be valid otherwise the Same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted.
