

Pensilvania 5.5.



By the Commissioners of Property.
 Upon an Agreement made with Thomas Groom,
 William Marshal & Thomas Kembal all of ye
 County of Philadia. for two thousand five Hund-
 red Acres of Land in the County of Bucks in that Tract
 commonly called the Great Swamp, ^{on ye usual Quitrent of one shilling sterling} for two thousand two
^{for each hundred} hundred and fifty Acres whereof they are to pay to ye Proprietors
 use after the Rate of twelve pounds p hundred and the other
 two hundred and fifty Acres to be allowed them for erecting
 a Grist Mill. These are to Authorize thee to survey or cause to
 be survey'd to the said Thomas Groom, William Marshal and
 Thomas Kembal according to the Method of Townships appoint-
 ed the said quantity of Two thousand five hundred Acres of
 Land that has not been already Survey'd, nor taken up, nor
 Seated by the Indians, adjoining to the Proprietors Mannor
 of Rich Land or some small part thereof out of ye sd Mannor
 if occasion be, provided that it take not in, any of the said
 Mannor that may be particularly valuable for ye goodness of
 the Soil or Conveniencies of Meadows. And make Returns there-
 of into the Secretaries Office. Which Survey shall be valid in
 case the said persons shall pay one half of the sd Consider-
 ation Money to the Proprietors use as aforesd on or before the
 sixteenth day of ye third Month [called May] Next and the
 other Moiety or half part upon or before the sixteenth day of
 November following for the sd 2250 Acres, And shall in twelve
 Months after ye Date hereof build a good Grist Mill on some
 part of the other 250 Acres. Otherwise ye said Survey with this
 Grant to be void. Given under our hands & Seal of the Province
 at Philadia the 28th day of Octob^r. A. D. 1713.
