



Pursuant to a Warrant to me directed by Edward Penington Surveyor General dated the 20th day of the 5th Month 1701. Laid out to Willm. Gibson in Right of his father William Gibson one Tract of Land within the County of Bucks Beginning at A white oake and a post marked for a Corner Then by Peter Worrals Land and vacant Land one hundred eighty four perches and a half <sup>N.W.</sup> to a post. Then by vacant Land <sup>S.W.</sup> four hundred thirty four perches to a heape of Stones Then South East one hundred eighty four perches & a half by Land left for a Road to a heape of Stones. Then by Richard Tuckers Land North East four hundred thirty four perches to <sup>& 73 perches.</sup> the place of Beginning Containeing five hundred acres ~~& 73 perches~~ Surveyed and Certefied under my hand the ~~27~~ 7th day of the 3 month 1701 p.
