

An Account of Lawrence & Joseph Growdon's Lands in Pennsylvania. Lawrence Growdon & his son Joseph Growdon being original purchasers each of five thousand acres in the Province aforesd. A Warrt. was granted by the proprietary to the sd. Lawrence & J Growdon for 5000^a. dated the 19th. 2^d. Mo 1683. Another Warrt. granted by the sd. prop^{ry}. to ^{sd.} Joseph Growdon for the overplus Land joining to him on the River Delaware dated the 5th. 6th. Mo. 1684. there are no Returns of the Original Surveys made in pursuance hereof now to be found in my Office ^{A Warrt. granted by the prop^{ry}. to Joseph Growdon dated ye 20th. 17th. Mo. 1689. for a Resurvey on ye Lands on Del. between ye Millers & Nathl. Allen's.}

A Warrt. granted by T Lloyd & Robt. Turner dated 15th 7^{mo}. 1685 to Joseph Growdon in behalf of himself & his Father Lawrence - for the Liberty Land appurtenant to their purchase of 10000 acres

4th. 1703 being the Remainder of his fathers & his own original purchase according to his Computation. Laid out on the 15th 4^{mo}. 1703. in Bucks County 1002^a. without Allowance.

Upon the Application of Joseph Growdon to the Commrs. on the 20th 1st. Mo. 1716 complain^g. of divers dissappointm^{ts}. in lay^g out his City Lots & being kept out from taking up the Lands due to him by the proprs. Concessions for importing above 90 servts. on his own Acct. In Consideracon whereof & of his publick services to this Governmt. the Commrs. granted him a Warrt. to take up 2000^a.

In pursuance whereof 1990 was laid out at Great Swamp & 510^a on Tohicon in Bucks County.
