Intr p. Wm. Holme. I have given out warrants for other lands to be layd out there, but lest they may not come to hand time enough, thou art to observe to begin at Saml. Clifts land & so lay out to Griffith Jones five hundred acres, next to Silas Crispin five hundred acres, next to myself five hundred Acres & the remainder ~~be~~ betwixt that & Capt. Markham's bounds to lay out & divide equally betwixt Tho. Rudiard & Wm. Haige so as Thomas Rudiard be layd next to mine & observe the rule of twenty pole to the hundred by the river side & make returne to me, dated 19th. 7^{mo}. 82.
