Hough's said Purchase According to ye Method of Townships appointed by ye Prop^{ty}. the said Number of three hundred and Seventy five Acres of Land in this Province that has not been already Survey'd nor taken up nor concealed nor Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretaries Office. Given under our hands and ye Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 24th. day of November in ye Year One thousand Seven hundred and one.
