

I do hereby certify That by virtue of a warrant under the hand and seal of Edward Penington Surveyor General to Phineas Pemberton directed bearing date the 13th. of the 11th month 1700 pursuant to the Proprietaries and Governours warrant to the said Edward Penington dated the 10th. day of the 11^{mo}. 1700 The said Phineas Pemberton hath made Return into the General Surveyor's office of the Resurvey of a Tract of Land Resurvey'd to Thomas Janney the 20th. of the 12th month 1701 which being Examined and Revised in the said office is as followeth viz^t The said Land scituate in Makefield in the County of Bucks beginning at a Corner white oak at the Corner of Richard Hough's land from thence Extending north 2 degrees westerly 200 perches to a Corner post thence west 112 perches to a white oak thence north by Overtons land 61 perches to a stone from thence South 71 degrees westerly by Brocks Land 58 pches to a white oak thence South 84 degrees westerly 92 pches to small black oak from thence North by west 98 perches then North 51 deg westerly 28 pches to a Corner Marked Chestnut tree from thence north 51 degrees westerly 23 perches to a post from thence south 38 degrees westerly 11 perches to a black oak thence south 24 degrees westerly 50 pches to a Corner black oak in Newtown Line then by the said line South South east 294 pches to a black oak then south 10 degrees east 75 perches to a black oak from thence south 32 degrees westerly 32 perches to a black oak Then south east by south 18 perches to a white oak from thence south east by east 21 perches to a white oak then south 10 degrees easterly 128 pches to a black oak sapling at John Houghs Corner then east 16 degrees northerly 34 perches to a Corner black oak ^{thence} _{North} one degree west 203 perches to a small Hickory tree standing at the Corner of Joshua Hoops his land thence east one hundred forty six perches to the place of beginning containing four hundred and forty acres.
