By the Commissioners of Property.

Whereas Robert Smith, John Kerk, John Roads, Thomas Collier and John Ball having each of them a Right to fifty Acres of headland in this Province as coming Servants into the same did transfer and make over all their Title and Interest therein to John Marshal of Darby who having also a Right to the like quantity himself on the aforesaid Account hath requested us to grant him to take up three hundred Acres of Land in and for the Several Rights aforesaid, ^{& a pen half penny sterlp Acre.} These are to require thee forthwith to Survey and lay out to the said John Marshal the said number of three hundred Acres of Land in the Township allotted for Servants where not already survey'd to nor taken up by any other and make Returns thereof into the General Surveyors Office at Philadelphia where this Warrant is to remain and a Copy thereof to be delivered to thee certified by the Secretary who is also to take a Duplicate of thy Return into his office. Given under our hands & the Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 18th. of the 12th. Moth. 1701.
