to take up five hundred Acres of Land part of 1500 Acres  
bought by Randal Blackshaw of James Harrison, Purchaser  
of 5000 Acres. These are to require thee forthwith to survey  
or cause to be survey'd to the Sd. Randal Blackshaw accord-  
ing to ye Method of Townships by me appointed the said num-  
ber of five hundred Acres of Land in this Province that has  
not been already survey'd nor taken up, nor is concealed,  
nor seated by the Indians. He seating and Improving the same  
within twelve Months after Survey. And make Returns  
thereof into my Secretaries Office. Given under my hand  
& Seal at Philadelphia the 2d. day of the ~~third~~ fourth Month  
1701. Wm. Penn.*
