

Pensilvania 5.5.



By the Commissioners of Property.

At the Request of John Henry Kieursen who Dwells near Schuykill that we would Grant him to take up the quantity of three hundred acres of Land at Oley in the County of Philadelphia for which he agrees to pay to ye use of the Trustees two & forty Pounds Mony of Pensilvania for the whole & the yearly quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for each hundred acres. These are to Authorize and require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the Said John Henry Kieursen at or near the place aforesaid according to the Method of Townships appointed the said quantity of three hundred acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretary's Office which Survey in case the Said John Henry fulfill ye above agreement within three months after the date hereof shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted. Given under our hands and ye Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the fourth day of October Anno Dni, 1718.
