



By ye Proprietary Deputies.

Whereas Walter King Setting forth to us that he had a warrant from ye Proprietary bearing date ye 17<sup>th</sup> of ye first Month <sup>1683</sup> Directed to ye Surveyr Genrl. to Lay out 700 acres of Land on pemapeckon - for him ye said Walter King in part of his purchase and yt but 500 thereof was Returned to ye Surveyr. Genrl. office by Thomas Fairman, Deputy Surveyr. the said Walter King - ing that we would grant him a warrant to Resurvey ye said Land Laid out for five hundrd. acres in order to Compleat ye 700 acres if so much should appeare to be within ye said tract or at least to Come as near it as what shall appeare to be above 500 ~~hundrd~~ acres will ad-towards ye Compleating ye 700 aforesaid.

These are therefore to will and Require thee forthwith to Re-quire thee to Resurvey ye said tract of Land above obl. and make a true obl. obl. Secrys office Dated at Philadelphia ye 25<sup>th</sup> 5 mo. 1687. Wm. Markham.
