By the Commissioners of Property.

At the Request of Joseph Kirkbride that we would Grant him to make an addition to a Tract of Land lately Survey'd to him above Manatawny of about One hundred & eighty two Acres for which he agrees to pay to the use of the Trustees of the Province Eighteen pounds ^{four shillings} _n Money thereof for ye whole & the yearly quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for the hundred Acres & in proportion thereunto for the rest. These are to Authorize & Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said Joseph Kirkbride at ye place aforesaid adjoining to his Said Tract of Land the aforesaid one hundred & eighty ^{two} _n Acres the same being Granted to render the said Tract more regular than before and make returns thereof into the Secretarys Office, which Survey in case the said Joseph fulfill the above agreement within three months after the date hereof shall be valid otherwise the same shall be void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted. Given under our hands and the lesser Seal of ye Province at Philadelphia the 10th day of September, Anno Dni. 1720.
