



By virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietarie and Governour directed to Edward Penington Surveyor General, and upon his decease, by the Proprietaries Comrs. directed to me, bearing date the 26th. day of the 5th. mo. 1701. Surveyed and Laid out unto Widow Musgrove 480 acres in the Township of Buckingham in the County of Bucks, Beginning at a heape of Stones at William Gibson's Corner Thence N. W. by Land for a Road 177 per. to a Post ~~in an Indian field.~~ Then by vacant Land N. E. 434. per. to a Post between two great Stones. Then by vacant and George Hayworth Land S. E. 177. per. to a Post at Gibson's other Corner. Then by the said Gibson's land S. W. 434 per. to the place of beginning, In Right of Richard Baker first Purchaser of 1000 acres.
