



By virtue of an Order from James Steel to me directed being date the six- of the second month 1721 depending upon an agreement maid som- years before surveyd unto Morris Morris thes two Tracts of Land in the great Swamp in Bux County. The first beginning at two whit- oaks standing in Joseph Gilberts Line and then by the said gilbarts Land South Seventy perches to a whit- oak then west Eight perches to a whit- oak then South two hundred and ninety perches to a post by a whit- oak by Morris's other Land then west one hundred and twenty four perches by Edward Robarts Land to a smal- gum then north thirty thre- hundred and sixty perches to a whit- oak by vacand Land then East one hundred thirty and two perches by vacand Land to the place of beginning two hundred Eighty and two acres of Land.

The second tract begineth at a whit- oak standing in Joseph Gordons Line then South two hundred perches to a smal- hickory by vacand Land then west one hundred and ninety perches to a whit- oak by vacand Land then north two hundred perches by vacand Land to a black oak standing in the said Gordons Line so along by the said East one hundred and ninety perches to the place of begining containing two hundred and thirty six acres. Both tracts containing five hundred acres of Land with som allowance for Roads and highways. Surveyd the twelt- of the second month in the yeare one thousand Seven hundred and twenty one by me
