

Pennsylvania S.s



By the Commissioners of Property

At the request of William Morgan of Manatawny that we would grant him to take up above the settlements of that place one hundred & fifty acres of land for which he agrees to pay to the Proprietors use two & twenty pounds ten shillings money of Pennsylvania ~~and~~ ten pounds part thereof at ye survey now to be made and the remainder within nine months after the date hereof and the yearly quitrent of one shilling and six pence ^{sterling} for the same. These are to authorize & require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd unto the said William Morgan at the place aforesaid according to the method of townships appointed the said one hundred and fifty acres of land that has not been already survey'd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make returns thereof into the Secretarys office which survey in case the said William — fulfill the above agreement shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted.
