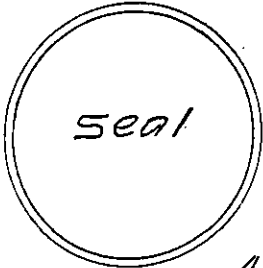

At the request of John Morris, that we would grant him to take up five hundred acres of land in part of two thousand five hundred by him bought of Thomas Fairman who purchased of Thomas Harley his right to five thousand acres originally purchased of the Proprietary. These are to require three fourths to survey or cause to be survey'd according to the method of townships to the sd. John Morris the sd number of five hundred acres of land in this Province not already survey'd nor taken up nor concealed nor seated by the Indians ~~to be~~ and make returns thereof into the Secretaries office. Given under our hands and seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 8th day of x^{br} 1701.
