



Elizabeth Whartnaby's land in the township of Lacock in the County of Chester survey'd obl. the Surveyor Genl's order the 18th day of October 1716. Beginning at a black oak being a corner of John Eastaugh and Company's land thence east by north by the land of Coll. John Evans & the Proprietor five hundred & forty perches to a white oak thence north by the land of Robert Way three hundred & forty perches to a black oak thence west by vacant land one hundred & fifty perches to a black oak thence south sixty degrees westerly by vacant land four hundred & eighty two perches to a post thence south by east by ye land of the sd. John Eastaugh & Company two hundred & three perches to the place of beginning containing one thousand acres with allowance of six P. C.
