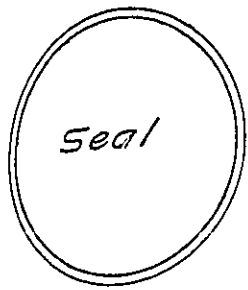

William Penn absolute Proprietary &  
Governor in Chief of the Province of Pennsil-  
vania & Counties annexed

At the request of John Martin that I would grant him to take  
up four hundred ninety and two acres in part and in right  
of ~~one thousand~~ <sup>five hundred</sup> acres originally purchased by Elizabeth  
Symes since Martin the said Johns late wife. These are to require  
thee forthwith to survey or cause to be survey'd (according to the  
method of townships by me appointed) to the said John Martin the  
said number of four hundreobl ninety and two acres of land in  
this Province <sup>where</sup> ~~not~~ already survey'd nor concealed, nor seated  
by the Indians and make returns thereof into my Secretaries  
office <sup>wh</sup> survey being duly made and returned if seated and  
improved within twelve months after date thereof shall be con-  
firmed to him <sup>his heirs</sup> and ~~his~~ assigns forever.

Given under my hand and seal at Philadelphia the last  
of the first month 1701.
