


By virtue of a warrant from ye Com<sup>rs</sup> dated ye 24<sup>th</sup> of ye 11<sup>th</sup> mo. 1690 directed to the Survey<sup>r</sup> Generall I do by authority from him certifie into the Secret<sup>ry</sup>s office that there was surveyed and laid out ye same day unto Peter Nelson old rent<sup>r</sup>, ffour certain peeces or prcills of land in ye township of Shakamaxunck in ye county of Philadelphia. The ffirst peece or prcill begineth at a corn<sup>r</sup> black oak of Jn<sup>o</sup> Tonks land thence N.N.W. by the same one hundred twenty eight perches to a corn<sup>r</sup> post of Robert Turners land thence S. 60<sup>o</sup> W. by ye said Turners land one hundred and eighty perches to a corn<sup>r</sup> post standing by ye Swamp<sup>e</sup> side ffr<sup>o</sup>m thence downe ye severall courses of ye same to a corn<sup>r</sup> white oak of Jn<sup>o</sup> Tonks ffr<sup>o</sup>m thence S. 16<sup>o</sup> E. one hundred and tenn perches to a corn<sup>r</sup> post standing near ye river Delaw<sup>e</sup> ffr<sup>o</sup>m thence ffollowing up ye severall courses thereof and ye swamp<sup>e</sup> to the ffirst mentioned place of beginning being one hundred and ffifty acres. The second peece or prcill begineth at a corn<sup>r</sup> white oak of W<sup>m</sup> Prestons thence S.S.E. by a line of trees eighty perches to a corn<sup>r</sup> post standing by a swamp<sup>e</sup> or crip<sup>e</sup> from thence following downe ye severall courses thereof to a corn<sup>r</sup> post of Robert Turners land thence ~~S.S.E.~~ N.N.W. by ye same one hundred twenty ffive perches, ffr<sup>o</sup>m thence E.N.E. by a line of trees one hundred ffourty three perches to ye first mentioned place of beginning being ninty acres of land. The third peece or prcill begineth at a corn<sup>r</sup> white oak standing by ye meadow side ffr<sup>o</sup>m thence N.N.W. by a line of trees one hundred eighty ffour perches to a corn<sup>r</sup> white oak standing by a swamp<sup>e</sup> side ffr<sup>o</sup>m thence ffollowing downe ye severall courses thereof to a corn<sup>r</sup> post of Gunnor Ramboes land thence S.S.E. by ye same 177 prchs to a corn<sup>r</sup> post standing by ye afore mentioned meadow ffr<sup>o</sup>m thence ffollowing up ye severall courses thereof to ye place of beginning being one hundred and ninty acres of land the ffourth peece or prcill ~~begineth~~ is ye one equall halfe of a peece of meadow swamp<sup>e</sup> and crip<sup>e</sup> containing in ye whole sixty seven acres which said tract is bounded to ye N.E. with Gunnor Ramboes meadow and crip<sup>e</sup> S. E. with ye river Delaware S. W. with John Tonks meadows and crip<sup>e</sup> and to ye N. W. with Gunnor Ramboes and Peter Nelsons ffast land which said tract of sixty seven acres is laid out unto ye said Peter Nelson and Mickell Nelson in which boath are equally concerned containing in all ye ffour (afore mentioned) prcills 468 acres and a halfe which is accordingly entred and recorded in the Survey<sup>r</sup> Generalls office at Philadelphia ye 6<sup>th</sup> of ye 8<sup>th</sup> mo. 1691
