Surveyed for Richard Tucker 100 acres of land being the over plus<sup>h</sup> land of the resurvey of Harmon Johnson surveyed by virtue of a warrent from the governour directed to me to lay out to Richard Tucker 100 acres.

beginning at a marked black oak standing by darby creek being the corner tree of Harmon Johnson from thence running N. N. W. 222 perch by a line of marked trees to a marked hickrey and from thence E. N. E. 100 perch to a marked white oak standing by darby creek being a corner tree of the John Otter's land and from thence down the creek on severall courses to the first menched black oak.
