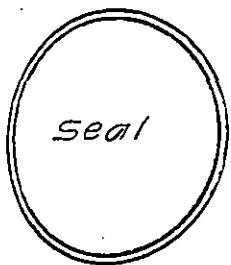

William Penn absolute Proprietary & Govern^r
in Chief of the Province of Pensilvania and Counties
annexed.

Whereas by warrant under my hand and seal in the year 1684
for the accommodation of y^e Welch purchasers who desired their
lands might be laid out contiguous one to another, I ordered
forty thousand acres to be laid out in one tract which was
accordingly done. These are now to require thee forthwith
and before any other survey be made in y^e County of
Philad^{ia} or of Chester to cause the whole said tract to be
resurvey'd according to the first outlines thereof and make
exact returns thereof into my Secretaries office. Given un-
der my hand and seal at Philadelphia the 4th day of y^e
12th month 1700.
