

The narrow strip of land joyning to Richard Thomas's land in the Welch tract lately granted to him the said Richard — begins at a white oak in a line of the said Welch tract and at a corner of the said R^d. Thomas his land thence by the said Richard's — land north seventy three degrees east nine hundred & eighty p^{er}ches to a hickery tree then south south east forty perches to a corner then by a line of mark'd trees south seventy three deg. west nine hundred and eighty p^{er}ches to a corner in the said Welch line the by the same north north west forty p^{er}ches to ye place of beginn^g containing two hundred and forty three acres.
