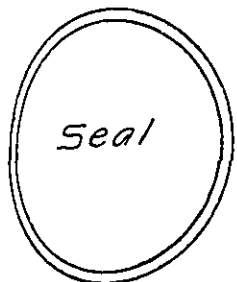

By the Commissioners of Property.

Whereas the Proprietary by his warrant under his hand and seal bearing date the 2^d of the 7th month in the year 1700 granted to James Thomas to take up three hundred acres of land in right of William Jenkins old purchaser of a thousand acres which thousand being one of the Welch purchases ought to have been laid in the Welch tract and the said James—
 accordingly requesting us by renewing the s^d warr^t to order the location thereof as afores^d. These are to require thee forthwth to survey and lay out in the Welch tract the s^d three hundred acres of land where not already survey'd nor taken up and make returns thereof into the Gen^l Surveyors office at Philad^{ia} where this warr^t is to remain and a copy thereof to be delivered to thee attested by the Secretary who is also to take a duplicate of thy return into his office. Given under our hands & the seal of the Province at Philad^{ia} the 18th of the 12th moth 1701.
