



These may certify that _____ by virtue of a warrant from Edward Penington Surveyor General to me directed dated the 16 day of the 10th mo. 1701. I resurvey'd to Peter Taylor a tract of land situate in Upper Providence in the County of Chester, beginning at a black oak by Chester road being the corner of ~~the~~ Thomas Powel's land thence south 32 degrees west in the line of the 5^d Thomas Powel & Thomas Butterfield 422 perches to a white oak by Ridley Creek thence up the said creek 108 18 perches north 17 W. 58. N. 35 W. 44 North 51 deg west 20 N. 35 west 36 N. 23 East 14 to a white oak thence in the line of Joseph Baker, Richard Bonds and Samuel Robinet north 32 east 456 per to a white oak by the said road's side thence south south east 101 perches by the 5^d road to John Calverts gate thence south 13 degrees east 102 perches to the first mentioned black oak containing 421 acres.
