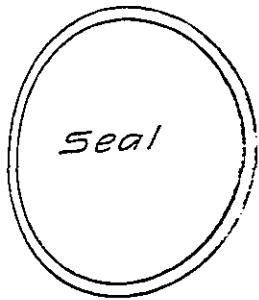


Pensilvania ss



By the Commissioners of Property

At the request of William Taylor of the County of Chester that we would grant him to take up two hundred and fifty acres of land in the said County for which he agrees to pay to the Proprietors use five and twenty pounds for the whole and the usual yearly quit-rent of one shilling sterling for each hundred acres and so in proportion for ye fifty acres. These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd unto the said William Taylor according to the method of townships appointed and within the said County the said quantity of two hundred and fifty acres of land that has not been already survey'd nor appropriated nor is seoted by the Indians and make a return thereof into the Secretary's office which survey in case the said William Taylor fulfill the above agreement within three months after the date hereof shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it <sup>had</sup> never been made nor this warrant ever granted. Given under our hands and seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 19<sup>th</sup> day of the 2<sup>nd</sup> mo<sup>th</sup> 1765.
