Then surveyed for Francis Yarnet 100 acres of land lying between Darby creek and Crum creek ~~having~~ beginning at a marked corner poplar standing near a run being a corner mark of John Simcock and of Georg Simcock and also of Joseph Steedmans land and from thence running N. 6. e. 160 perch to a marked post being a corner mark of Georg Meeris land from thence along the 5<sup>d</sup> Meeris line of marked trees N. W. 160 perch to a marked post being also a mark of Georg Meeris and from thence S. 142 perch to a marked chestnut tree being the corner tree of Joseph Steedman and from thence <sup>150 perch</sup> S. e. B. S. along the 5<sup>d</sup> Steedmans line of marked trees to the first mentioned poplar.
