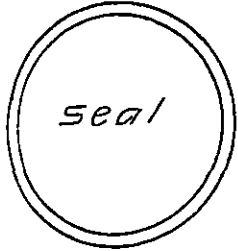


Pennsylvania 5s.

At the request of Isaac Taylor surveyor of the county of Chester that we would grant him to take up ~~take up~~ two hundred acres of land within the said county in right of William Beckingham, John Beckingham, James Heyward & Sam^l Bishop ^{or about} who came servants into this Province on the year 1682 and have now sold their several rights to the said Isaac Taylor.

These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be surveyed unto the said Isaac Taylor according to the method of townships appointed the said quantity of two hundred acres of land that has not been already survey'd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians to be holden of ye Propriet^r under the yearly quitrent of a half penny sterling for every acre thereof and make a return of the same into the Secretarys office in order to a further confirmation. Given under our hands and seal of the Province at Philad^a the 20th of ye 7th moth A.D. 1716
