Surveyed for Anthony Weaver the ashes of W^m Gisill 125 acres of land lieng on the west side of ~~Stock Creek~~ Chester creek backwards in the woods begining at a marked black oak being a corner tree of W^m Woodmansey ~~and a~~ and standing in the line of Mikell Isards land and runing w. s. w. along the sd Isards line and into the woods 400 perch to a ~~white~~ ^{red} oak and from thence ~~to the~~ N. W. 50 perch to a white oak and from thence E. N. E. 400 perch to a marked poste standing by W^m Woodmansey meadow and from thence along the meadow upon severall coarses to the first men chened black oak
