At the request of Isaac Taylor of the County of Chester surveyor that we would grant him to take up amongst the late surveys made in the said County the quantity of one hundred acres of land in right of John Bromal and John Glews who came servants into this Province about the year 1682 and have now sold their rights to ye sd Isaac ———. These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be surveyed unto the said Isaac Taylor in the said County according to the method of townships appointed the said quantity of one hundred acres of land that hath not not been already surveyed nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians to be holden of the Propriety under the yearly quitrent of an English or Sterling half penny for every acre thereof and make returns of the same into the Secretarys office in order for further confirmation. Given under our hands and seal of the Province at Philad<sup>a</sup> ye 18<sup>th</sup> of ye 7<sup>m<sup>o</sup></sup> Anno Dni 1717
