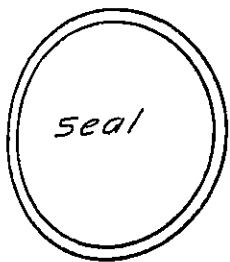

Whereas Robert Vernon of the County of Chester obtained a warrant from ye Propriet<sup>rs</sup> for laying out two hundred and eighty five acres of land w<sup>ch</sup> quantity he is desirous ~~to~~ should be made up six hundred acres and be laid out on the north east side of Brandywine—beyond the Barrens and the Welch tract which for several good considerations we have granted at the rate of ten pounds ~~of~~ cent. These therefore are to require thee to survey & lay out to the sd Robert Vernon according to the method of townships appointed the quantity of three hundred and fifteen acres of land in the sd place in one tract with the aforementioned 285 acres formerly granted without culling or choosing and make returns into the General Surveyors office at Philadelphia where this warr<sup>t</sup> is to remain and a copy thereof to be del<sup>iv</sup>d to thee certified by ye Secretary.
