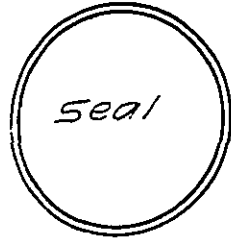


Pensilvania ss.



By the Commissioners of Property

At the request of Ann Welch of Chesham in the County of Bucks in Great Britaine by her Attorney ~~Robert Jones~~ that we would grant her to take up for the use of her children two hundred and twenty acres of land in this Province in right of Robert Jones late of Cholsbury in the said County of Bucks deceased who purchased of the Prop^{rs} five hundred acres by indentures of lease & release bearing date ye 3^d & 4th days of febr^y 1681 two hundred & eighty acres thereof being already laid ^{out}. These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd unto the said Ann Welch for the use of her children according to the method of townships appointed the said quantity of two hundred and twenty acres of land in the sd Province that has not been already survey'd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make a returne into the Secretarys office in order to a further confirmation. Given under our hands and seale of the Province at Philadelphia the 5th day of the 9th month Anno Dni 1714
