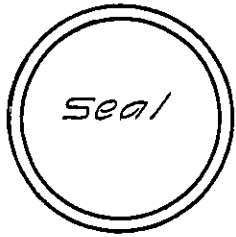

At the request of Hannah Musgrove Widow of Thomas Musgrove that I would grant her to take up four hundred and eighty acres of land the remainder of a purchase of one thousand acres made by Rich^d Baker whose right the sd Thomas — purchased to the same. These are to require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd to the sd Hannah Musgrove according to ye method of townships by me appointed the sd number of four hundred and eighty acres of land that has not been already survey'd nor is concealed nor seated by the Indians together with twenty acres of liberty land proportionable to the sd purchase she or her assigns seating ye same wth in 12 months after ye date of survey of w^{ch} thou art required to make returns wth all convenient speed.
