

## Pennsylvania

By virtue of a warrant from the Proprietary & Govern<sup>t</sup> to me directed & dated the 26<sup>th</sup> instant requiring me to survey or cause to be surveyed unto John Moon & Griffith Jones five hundred acres a pece unto Barriabas Wilcox six hundred acres unto John Barnes and Thomas Bowman five hundred acres a peece unto Thomas Durket Jn<sup>r</sup> Goodson & Jn<sup>r</sup> Longhurst three hundred acres a peece unto Richard Townsend one hundred and fifty acres all together in a place not already taken up according to the method of townshipp appointed by the Govern<sup>t</sup> and whereas the Govern<sup>t</sup> hath ordered Richard Noble to survey and surround a tract of land adjoining to the City of Philadelphia for the good and benefit of the first purchasers ~~where~~ whereof a returne is not yet made unto me & so the extreme parts or bounds not yet ascertained and whereas I have ordered thee to set out the townshipp of Oxford als Tacomey to the northern side of that creek where severall purchasers are already placed & seated and will extend above one townshipp from the bounds of the Swedes lands and that in the next townshipp backward some are already placed & seated both which townshipp are the very next townshipp to the City lands as far as I can perceive I therefore hereby authorize thee to survey and set out unto the above said persons their respective quantities of lands (by lot or as they shall agree among themselves in respect to order of first & last) in the remaining part of the <sup>sd</sup> second townshipp, ever observing that in the said townshipp & all other townshipp hereafter to be layd out where people are not already placed the latter moyety of the said townshipp on both sides of the streets be reserved for the purchasers not already come over which I have in charge by a warrant from the Govern<sup>t</sup> to observe & follow and make me a true returne both of the original field work & protracted figure which by my pattent is to remain in my office, dated at Philadelphia the 28<sup>th</sup> 12<sup>mo</sup>. 1682.
